Welcome to the first Devizes Westminster newsletter of 2009. We would like to bring you up to date with this year's race. If you're paddling, there's news. If you're curious and want to get involved, why not volunteer to help. And if you took part recently, just remember the pleasure and the pain. "Windows at Teddington"

For the last few years we have applied a time limit at Teddington for the Senior Doubles race which allows crews only to paddle through Teddington and down the Tideway during a four hour window commencing 30 minutes before High Water and ending 3 hours 30 minutes after High Water. Crews arriving prior **to** the start of the window are held at Teddington and given no time allowance. Crews arriving after the closure of the window are held till the next tide and given no time allowance. This arrangement will remain in force for the first tide on Easter Sunday but the second tide window will be shortened to 2 hours. This second window will run from 30 minutes prior to High Water to 1 hour 30 minutes after High Water. This purpose of this alteration is to avoid having crews on the Tideway excessively late in the evening.

Free Accommodation in Devizes

As in previous years, paddlers taking part in the Four Day events may spend the Thursday night prior to the race either in the Devizes Corn Exchange or in the Scout Headquarters. If you're thinking of using this option, please see the <u>location map on the website</u>. A brief reminder that these buildings shut their doors at 10 pm so it is crucial that anyone intending to spend the night there should be in the building before that time.

Paddlers taking part in the Senior Doubles Event may spend the Friday night in the Scout Headquarters but the Corn Exchange is not available that night.

Appeal for Volunteers

DW is run entirely by volunteers and we are always looking for people to help with the running of the race. In particular, this year we would welcome help with the following:

- someone able to put in place the various road warning notices that we post near road crossings on the course and retrieve them afterwards.
- marshals to assist at Westminster for the race finish.
- additional help to supplement our "Steps Crew" the vital team who stand in the water at the finish and help all the paddlers out of their boats and up the stairs.
