

#### **Devizes to Westminster 2012 – Senior Doubles**

## **SENIOR DOUBLES (NON-STOP)**

#### Overall rules

All Senior Doubles entrants must be 18 years of age or older on the 1st of January in the year of the Race.

## **Timings**

This category will be timed continuously from Devizes to Westminster, irrespective of any stop. Competitors must pick a start time that enables them to reach Teddington within the permitted tide windows, as set out below.

# Competitors must start between 0700-2000 hours on Easter Saturday.

Crews should start before 1200 unless (a) they are fast enough to reach the first tide at Teddington on the Sunday by starting after then, or (b) they are too slow to reach the first Sunday tide at Teddington even if they start at the earliest opportunity on Saturday morning and aim therefore to catch a later tide.

Any crews planning to start between 1200-2000 on Easter Saturday <u>must</u> without fail tell the Chief Umpire of their plan to do so by the Wednesday preceding the race. This is so that a Race official is present to record their actual departure time. This information will not be shared with other competitors. You must receive a written confirmation from the Chief Umpire for your late start to be accepted.

Please note, the Organisers will not modify start windows to enable people to 'fit' DW into a multi-event endurance challenge. Allowing crews to start outside our start windows causes undue problems for checkpoints and creates difficulties for safety personnel who need to focus on the precise locations where they know competitors will be.

# **Teddington Tide Windows**

Crews arriving on the first tide on the Sunday will only be permitted to pass through Teddington during the period starting 30 minutes before high water and ending 3 hours and 30 minutes after high water.

The tide window at Teddington for the Sunday evening tide will be 2 hours long. It will open 30 minutes before high water and close 1 hour and 30 minutes after high water.

Crews arriving before or after these times will be required to wait for the next tide window and no time allowance will be given. There will be no exceptions to this rule. Crews arriving after the closure of the second tide window on Sunday must portage via the towpath to Thames Young Mariners, 500 metres downstream of Teddington Lock, and may only restart on Monday's morning tide as directed by the Starter.

#### Cut-off times for the canal section

In the interests of safety at the Westminster end of the course, there are now two 'cut-off" times on the canal section of the course.

- Newbury Wharf. Any crew who takes more than 10 hours to reach Newbury Wharf from Devizes will be excluded from the race and must leave the water at Aldermaston having informed Control that they have done so.
- Dreadnought Reach. Any crew who takes longer than 15.5 hours to reach Dreadnought Reach from Devizes will be excluded from the race and will be expected to leave the water by Marsh Checkpoint having informed Control that they have done so.

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# **Entry procedures**

All crews must have entered the race by the Sunday two weeks before Easter – the weekend of Waterside D. A member of the DW Organising Team will be at Newbury to collect entries. No late entries or entries on the day will be accepted.

Crews must report to a Marshall for a kit check at Devizes Wharf at least 60 minutes before their intended start time.

After a satisfactory kit check and signing the Indemnity/Declaration form, crews go to the Competition Secretary's office to collect their number disc/bib/plate and have their competitor bracelets attached.

Any late changes to crew members must be notified to the Competition Secretary at this time.

Competitors who haven't had their kit checked and collected their number disk and bracelets by 1200 on Easter Saturday and who have not personally told the Chief Umpire by the Wednesday preceding the race that they plan to start after 1200 will be deemed to have scratched and will not be permitted to start.

## **Compulsory equipment**

In addition to clothing worn by crews at the start, the following SERVICEABLE equipment must be carried. Crews will not be allowed to start without these items.

This kit will be inspected at the start and may be checked at the finish or at any point along the course, for which a time allowance will be given. Penalties will be imposed in respect of items missing.

The following must be treated as individual items and NOT serve a dual purpose:

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Notes:

- (1) Life jacket and buoyancy aid specifications are detailed in the General Rules.
- (2) Survival bag specifications are detailed in the General Rules.
- (3) From sunset to sunrise paddlers must attach an activated white light stick to the right shoulder of their buoyancy aid. Any boat not displaying lights as set out in the rules will be stopped.
- (4) In addition: <u>below the Wokingham Waterside Centre (Dreadnought Reach) and until</u> <u>disembarkation.</u> all boats must display without fail. between sunset and sunrise. a battery-powered white light facing forward.
- (5) Below Teddington each boat must carry a torch ready for instant showing in any direction.
- (6) At Devizes all crews must provide the number of a working mobile phone held by their Chief Supporter or Team Leader so that the Organisers can contact them in the event of an emergency. Unsupported crews must provide the number of a phone to be carried with them in the boat. The Organisers recommend that all crews carry a working mobile phone in a waterproof pouch.

#### **Procedure at Westminster**

The finish is on the right hand bank about 50 metres below Westminster Bridge. Crews should not stop paddling until they hear the finish signal. Upon finishing crews should follow the instructions of the safety crew and disembark on the County Hall steps.
