

Devizes to Westminster 2012 - Veteran / Junior Doubles (Four Stages)

The veteran member of the crew shall be over 35 years, and the junior member of the crew under 19 years and not less than 15 years of age, on the 1st of January in the year of the race

Course details

Day 1 (Good Friday)	Devizes to Newbury	34 miles
Day 2 (Easter Saturday)	Newbury to Marlow	36 miles
Day 3 (Easter Sunday)	Marlow to Ham	38 miles
Day 4 (Easter Monday)	Ham to Westminster	17 miles

Timings

Crews must report on day one for Kit Check one hour prior to their intended start time at Devizes. Start times over the Easter Weekend are as follows:

Devizes	0930-1030. Slow boats must start earlier by arrangement with the Official Starter who may be contacted on 01983 731403	As directed
Newbury and Marlow	0645 - 0900, slowest first, at intervals as directed. Fastest 15 at 2 minute intervals 0930-1000. Details of start windows will be available after the finish on previous day.	As directed
Ham	Around High Tide, exact times to be advised during the weekend.	As directed

Finishing arrangements

Friday	Newbury	On the right-hand side of the canal at Northcroft Leisure Centre
Saturday	Marlow	On the right-hand side of the river at Longridge Scout Camp
Sunday	Ham	On the right-hand side of the river at Thames Young Mariners
Monday	Westminster	On the right-hand side below Westminster Bridge

Crews should not stop paddling until they hear the finish signal; an air-horn, bell or whistle. Upon finishing they must follow instructions of safety boat crew or race officials. Crews finishing more than 10 hours after their start time will not be permitted to start again on the following day and will be deemed to have retired.

Junior / Veteran Doubles end-of-stage arrangements

Competitors in the junior/veteran doubles event may either leave the course between each day's racing or camp on site. Those using the sites will rise in time to pack up, clean their quarters and place all refuse in the bins. Competitors are responsible for making sure that they have carefully checked their published start times for the following day. The organisers will bear no responsibility for any failure by the paddlers to turn up on time. Start windows will not be extended for latecomers.

Compulsory equipment

In addition to clothing worn by crews at the start, the following SERVICEABLE equipment must be carried. Crews will not be allowed to start without these items. This kit will be inspected at the start and may be inspected at the finish; it may also be inspected at any point or points along the course for which a time allowance may be given. Penalties will be imposed in respect of items missing.

The following must be treated as individual items and NOT serve dual purposes:

Notes:

- (1) Life jacket and buoyancy aid specifications are detailed in the General Rules.
- (2) Survival bag specifications are detailed in the General Rules.

In the event of a very early tide on the last stage, all boats will have to display a forward-facing battery-powered white light. They will also have to carry a torch ready for instant showing in any direction. Each competitor must also display a white light stick, attached to their buoyancy aid/life jacket. For Veteran/Junior doubles competitors, these items do not have to be carried in the boat during the preceding stages of the Race but they <u>must</u> be produced by support crews at Ham for use if required on Easter Monday. For the 2012 race, the early tide times means that competitors in the four-day events WILL require lights and WHITE light sticks. No other colour lightstick will be permitted.

At Devizes all crews must provide the number of a working mobile phone held by their Chief Supporter or Team Leader so that the Organisers can contact them in the event of an emergency. Unsupported crews must provide the number of a phone to be carried with them in the boat. The Organisers recommend that all crews carry a working mobile phone in a waterproof pouch. This number must be recorded on the entry form at the time of kit inspection.

Support restrictions apply in this class

Severe congestion and over-crowding at portages means entrants in the Junior/Veteran Doubles event are limited to 2 support vehicles each and 4 bibbed support crew only. Teams of more than three crews will be permitted one additional Team Leader vehicle and an extra supporter bib. Full details are outlined in Rules for Supporters.
